

MODERN SLAVERY STATEMENT 2024-2025

INTRODUCTION

This statement sets out Plasmic HealthSciences UK Limited's actions to understand and mitigate all potential modern slavery and human trafficking risks in relation to its business and supply chain. This statement relates to actions and activities during the financial year 1 April 2023 to 31 March 2024.

Plasmic HealthSciences recognises that it has a responsibility to take a robust approach to slavery and human trafficking. We are proud of the steps we have taken to combat slavery and human trafficking both within our business and our supply chain. We recognise that this is an ongoing obligation, and we will strive to update this statement on an annual basis with new initiatives and our progress.

WHO WE ARE

We deal with Delivery, storage and sales of medical supplies to the healthcare industry. items. Plasmic HealthSciences is a SME based in the UK with no offices outside UK.

1. We will continue to develop risk assessments in procurement to identify areas of slavery and human trafficking risk in Plasmic supply chain
2. Incorporate a Whistleblowing Policy and training of staff.
3. Annual employee training on the Whistleblowing Policy and Modern Slavery Act.
